
Amman: Students from Middle East University showcased their enthusiasm for recycling and the green economy at an international conference funded by the United States Agency for International Development.







Second Place Award: Middle East University's Tech Bracelet Allows Access to People Trapped under Rubble in Gaza



Amman – The "Ghazathon" competition, held at the Hussein Technical University, saw extensive participation with 130 teams from various academic institutions, competing to present innovative solutions addressing humanitarian and technological issues.

The team "Ohm (Unit of Electrical Resistance)," founded by Fatima Asaad Saleh, a student in the College of Information Technology at Middle East University, distinguished itself by winning second place in the health category with its pioneering project, "Sawar" (Bracelet).

The Dean of the College, Professor Dr. Mohammad Atir, explained that the «Sawar» project is based on an innovative concept designed to provide a practical and effective solution for the people of Gaza who suffer amid the harsh Israeli aggression. The project aims to develop a small communication device embedded in a wearable bracelet to help emergency and rescue teams locate individuals trapped under rubble or affected by structural collapses.

The project supervisor, Engineer Laith Walid Al-Shihab, a faculty member in the college, described "Sawar" as a real example of how technology can serve humanity in exceptional circumstances, especially in Gaza, where significant challenges persist. This achievement underscores the capacity of Jordanian youth to provide creative solutions that meet the urgent needs of their communities by leveraging modern technological tools to foster a safer and more stable future.

The "Sawar" project relies on a mechanism utilizing Bluetooth technology connected to a smart application. This app measures the Bluetooth signal strength to identify how close rescue teams are to the bracelet, enabling precise location of individuals under debris.

This project represents a critical step in enhancing rescue efforts in areas affected by recurring attacks from the occupation forces, as well as in regions hit by various natural disasters. It reduces the time needed to reach individuals, thus increasing the chances of saving lives.

In light of contemporary challenges, their role in confronting extremism and raising societal awareness is more crucial than ever, as they play an active role in establishing values of dialogue and tolerance and contributing to societal decisions that strengthen social peace and security.

For his part, the Director of the Community Peace Center, Colonel Omar Al-Khalayleh, expressed his deep appreciation for the strategic cooperation between the Public Security Directorate and the university.



He pointed out that organizing such events reflects a genuine commitment to enhancing societal awareness of the important and vital national role of women.

Al-Khalayleh emphasized that women, through their influential roles within the family and their social environment, help build an intellectual and cultural wall that protects society from drifting toward extremism and deviation from the right path. No sector can thrive in the absence of community peace, which is the true entry point for sustainable development and economic and social well-being, with a focus on the role of Jordanian women as a key element in shaping a valuable and cohesive society. Throughout history, women have proven their ability to bear significant responsibilities in various fields, excelling in education, health, economy, and politics, which has made them a vital pillar for achieving community stability.

The sessions of the three-day workshop discussed the strategies employed by the Community Peace Center, as well as the real challenges posed by extremist ideologies on communities and the role of academic institutions, media, and the family in consolidating community peace values.

The workshop also addressed sensitive topics such as online recruitment, female recruitment, and the danger of electronic games on youth, with a focus on the impact of hate speech and rumors in threatening community peace. This underscores the importance of confronting these challenges through uniting national efforts and enhancing community awareness.

In his remarks, Former Minister of Information, Eng. Sakher Dodin, stated at the seminar, which was attended by notable government officials, experts, employers, and representatives of media organizations, that international accreditation provides educational institutions with an evaluation framework that enhances the quality of their programs. Accreditation in education enables students to engage with the labor market. It was further stated that accreditation will equip students of the Faculty of Media with the requisite knowledge and skills to attract job opportunities and facilitate their entry into the media market, which has become increasingly complex and competitive.

In addition, Eng. Dodin highlighted the distinctive responsibilities of a journalist, emphasising that in addition to disseminating information, they possess a moral and professional obligation towards society. The international accreditation

will instill in university students the necessary professional tools to fulfil their role responsibly and professionally.

In his speech at the seminar, moderated by Dr. Hani Al-Badri, a journalist and faculty member at the Faculty of Media, Senator Dr. Yaqoub Nasereddin, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Middle East University, described the faculty's attainment of FIBAA accreditation as an exceptional achievement and a significant milestone in its pursuit of global standards in higher education, emphasising that the university does not view accreditation as a mere certificate or classification, but rather a commitment towards a sober and perfect education that meets the latest international standards, adding that this achievement would not have been achieved without the efforts of the dedicated team and our continuous investments in infrastructure development.
